To be eligible for the PDA Waiver Program, seniors must be 60 years or older, their income must be equal to or less than 300 percent of the Federal Benefit Rate, their resources must be \$2,000 or less, and they must require the level of care offered at accredited nursing facilities.

The Personal Emergency Response Systems would be arranged by various senior service providers at the county level and installed by SafetyCare, with payment provided through Medicaid.
